125 Year Celebration (500 Lacrosse Tournament – April 2024)

In April 2024 the club hosted the 500 Lacrosse Tournament which was a friendly competition between the 4 Lacrosse clubs in Australia that celebrated their 125-year anniversary in 2024.

Following learnings form the 2023 Senior Nationals Competition, running the 500 tournament was a lot smoother, profitable with lower costs for hosting the event for the club.

The turnover from the bar and canteen for the 3 days was \$14,090, assigning food and drink costs of \$7,252 and \$1,500 paid to East Fremantle to subsidise their costs resulted in a profit to the club of \$5,338 for hosting the event.

CLUB OPERATIONS (Excluding 125 Above)

As per the 2023 year I have prepared the income and expenses of the club to provide a summary of the operations of the club without the impact of once off events that may not be repeated in the future.

The operations of the club generated a loss for the year of \$5,431. Included in these results are 2 abnormal items being:

• Additional rental payment to OSR

\$ 2.223

A reconciliation of the rental payments to OSR confirmed that there was an outstanding payment for grounds hire due of \$2,223, this was due to OSR not being consistent in sending out their invoices. All monthly payments to OSR are now made by direct debt each month.

• 2023 Sports vouchers loss

\$ 3,400

With a change to the date required for claiming the 2023 vouchers and complication's accessing the system, we were unable to claim the 2023 vouchers. As at the date of this report we have lodge the 2024 vouchers and been paid for the majority.

Income

Canteen & Bar Sales

The canteen and bar generated income for the 12 months of \$57,821 vs \$59,833 for the prior year

The canteen and bar sales generated a profit for the club of \$28,061.

Player Fees

Player fees for the 2024 year was \$26,734 which reflects the increase in player numbers during the year. For reference Lacrosse SA charges \$215 each registered player regardless of age.

Expenses

- The operational expenses for the club were \$70,282, and increase from the prior year of \$6,098
- Ground Hire

Our lease with the Office of Sport and Recreation and is paid on a monthly basis for the full 12 months. The current monthly fee is \$2,223.38 with additional costs for lighting and other events.

Player Nomination Fees

Each player is required to be registered with Lacrosse SA which incurs a cost of \$215.00 per player regardless of age, i.e. juniors and seniors are the same fee.

Umpire Fees

Umpire fees are based on the number of teams entered during the year, with adding an additional team our fees have increased accordingly.
