We all knew the 2021 season was going to be a difficult year with no club rooms and no home grounds and with the threat of many Covid 19 restrictions and shutdowns, we were lucky to have a relatively uninterrupted season.

Teams we fielded this year, with 2 combining with other clubs:

- Mixed U8's
- Ull Boys
- U11 Girls
- U13 Boys Finished 4th of 9
- U13 Girls Finished 6th of 7
- U15 Boys Finished 2nd of 6
- U 15 Girls Finished 9th of 9
- U17 Boys (combined with Burnside) Finished 4th of 4
- Men's Div2 Finished 4th of 8
- Women's Div1 finished 5th of 5
- Men's State League Finished 4th of 7
- Women's State League (combined with Woodville)
 Finished 3rd of 5

Given the challenges of the year, we saw great success on and off the field. With the disruptions of our preseason trainings being shuffled over two different locations before finally relocating back to Gordon Brown Oval (the Upper Grounds) of the Women's Memorial Playing Fields.

All our Boys teams played in the finals with the U15's finishing minor Premiers and just missing out on the premiership in a golden goal grand final. Our Men's State League team making finals for the first time in over a decade.

The girls highlight was between our Div2 team taking on the challenge of stepping up a grade to Div1 to further build their skills, well done, and our State League girls combined Blue Warriors Team continuing's its successful formula finishing higher than the previous year in an awesome third overall.

Behind the scenes success was led by a very welcomed re-branding of our club. This injected vigour, enthusiasm and club belonging in an otherwise disjointed season and sent a strong 'watch this space' message to our competitors. Additional improvements was a refurbished website with an online shop, reformed social media, teams communication via Team App and utilising Slack app — enabling greater communications for our committee.

We still have a long way to go however with more hard work, increasing numbers and further development, in particular with our Juniors. Combine this with outstanding training fields – with lighting and clubrooms – one can't help but feel the momentum is building in the right direction for success for our club.

FINANCES

We had predicted the treasures report would return a deficit this year. Given the lack of revenue which heavily relies on the clubrooms and bar to generate income through social functions. Throw in the rebranding and new uniforms, spending was up however the price we paid doesn't reflect the non-monetary return in pride and club ownership from our players.

We were fortunate with the support from the Office of Recreation, Sport δ Racing (ORSR) providing a











reduction in cost for our ground fees for this year, which helped greatly minimise our overall deficit. Having said that, moving forward one can only expect grounds and clubroom costs are only going to further increase from what we have paid in the previous. To overcome these rises we need to make sure we utilise our new facilities to the full advantage, strengthening our incoming revenue through increased junior numbers, additional club functions and fundraising events.

GROUNDS REDEVELOPMENT

After an extremely delayed and slow start, the build and ground works got underway. ISAS field has been completely ripped up, levelled and extended with irrigation and drainage sorted.

A full upgrade to the electrical supply with the inclusion of a new transformer should see out all our power needs. Footings and underground electrical works with various switchboard installed around the premises have been installed for lighting on all three ovals. Only lighting towers have been erected on ISAS field at this stage due to supply issues and Covid these have been resolved and further towers will be erected shortly.

The clubrooms are looking fabulous, with a real modern look and with what can only be described as absolutely stunning views over our grounds. These, if not already, will reach lock up stage and is still on target for completion for the commencement of next years season.

Mitcham Council looks set to take over these facilities. Final negotiations between them and ORS on how the running and how that all looks is still on going.

CONCLUSION

My thanks goes out to every club person for their cooperation, patience and understanding throughout this challenging year. Congratulations to all our teams and coaches on their success they have achieved. To all the parents who have rallied together to support our teams and club, I thank you. A special mention has to go to my committee, your work effort and dedication to enable our club to survive and run this year has been second to none. So what lies ahead? As our momentum continues to build. Coupled with the new grounds, lighting and facilities with the determination to succeed. Our future is looking bright and I'm excited for the 2022 season and to further improve our stance in the lacrosse community

TREASURER'S REPORT 2021

The following is the treasures report for the period as per follows:

- Dates 1 November 2020 31 October 2021 (note the prior years was 1 November 2019 15 November 2020 whilst a duplication of 15 days being 1 to 15 November 2020 there was no transactions on these days)
- The Clubs gross receipts are less than \$500,000 as a result the clubs financial records are not required to be, and have not been, audited.

SUMMARY

For the 12 months to 31 October 2021 the club generated a loss of \$14,638.02.

The club was able to absorb the loss as in prior years it had been operating at a surplus. The surplus funds had been retained within the clubs bank account for either loss of the lease on the grounds and to provide funds such as periods like this year with no bar and canteen facilities and reduced income due to Covid restrictions.

As at 31 October 2021 the club has bank accounts and term deposits with a total balance of \$54,089.22.

Even with uncertainties of the next 12 months the club is in a strong financial position.

INCOME

The total revenue of the club for the 12 months was \$57,536 of which the main sources of income was as follows:

The clubs income was impacted dramatically with no bar and canteen sales which in prior years had generated income of \$26,004 (2019), \$29,342 (2018).

EXPENSES

The total expenses of the club for the 12 months was \$72,174.32 of which the main sources of expense was as follows:

The uniform expense was for purchasing uniforms for all players in the club for the 2021 year. The uniforms remain the property of the club and this expenditure will reduce in future years as only replacements are required.

WOMEN'S STATE LEAGUE 2021 – BLUE WARRIORS

This year has seen an unfortunate loss of a number of key senior players from this group.

Due to previous late starts around this playing group the committee's decision to move quickly to secure a 2021 combined side with Woodville for a second year as the Blue Warriors brought some excellent success on the field finishing 3rd on the ladder and provided the current group a sense of certainty about the future of there lacrosse.

This has shown us as a club the development of this structure early can be key to the success of our players with marked improvements shown in each of the girls this year.

Even though the playing group is small with only 5 players they are the backbone of the senior players group and have seen substantial playing time on the field. Each of the players has confirmed they will be looking at continuing with Sturt Lacrosse club if the same option continues with the Blue Warriors for the 2022 season.

Even though we only have 5 girls currently in the squad, I can see benefits with this continuing as the opportunities open up for us to have a number of Friday night games under lights with the club facilities providing revenue raising and profile building for Sturt. This also provides an opportunity for possible pathways for other younger players from our Div 1 group.

Unfortunately I do not see Sturt having the capacity to field a team on our next season in State league as such I would suggest that the new committee looks at a discussion with Woodville to secure a decision early to allow us to plan strategically for training and games that can be played under lights.

JUNIOR TEAMS REPORTS

UNDER 8'S

We had an amazing group of U8's this year with an all boy team, 6 of which have played together in previous years and one new player who fit in really well and took to lacrosse like a duck to water. We started the year well and didn't take a step backwards. We tried to keep our trainings consistent with teaching the basics skills that are required for under 8's and also mixing that with a lot of fun and making sure we kept the boys engaged which was sometimes the hardest part. It was great to see how far the boys had come this year and from previous seasons and we saw a few players really come out of their shells. Our passing became progressively better throughout the season and we began scoring goals from 2-3 and sometimes 4 passes. The boys started to learn to read the play and we began to see a lot of intercepts down in defense. I couldn't have been more proud of the way the boys played each week and the sportsmanship these young boys shower towards other teams that sometimes did behave the same way to us unfortunately.

The majority of the team will be moving up to U11's next year, it will be great to see them move up to the next grade together. There isn't much more that I can report other than it has been great coaching such and awesome group and I really look forward to watching them grow up and play together through the years. There is definitely some future lax superstars in this group.

UNDER 11 GIRLS

U11G had 9 players this season. 5 were 2nd year U11G including Ava Gibson, Bridget Wapper, Jessica Bauer (my stepdaughter), Ruby Kirby and Sara Day. 4/9 players did not play the previous year, Kiara Tuxford who chose to play up as the only U8 girl, Floss Parr whose sister plays U15s, Roisyne Kay a school friend of Bridget Wapper and Alice Hodges who was recruited from a school clinic.

We played a total of 14 games, 12 official rounds plus 2 extra in the July holidays for which we didn't complete scoresheets. We finished with 13 wins 1 loss (93%) and 114 goals scored versus 71 conceded (161%).

My approach to training and games this year has always been with a focus on making sure the girls are enjoying participating in lacrosse, learning about fair play behaviours and growing as individuals and as a team.

In the spirit of the U11 competition, we managed games where we were dominating other teams by ensuring all players scored goals, taking extra passes and shooting with non-preferred hands. At training we concentrated on fundamentals of communication, catching and throwing whilst running, ground balls, moving to open up passing lanes to receive and dispose of the ball, playing 1v1 close defence as well as clearing/transition ball and setting up defensively and in attack and not crowding the in-goal area.

Throughout the season Ava, Ruby and Sara played a significant number of games for the U13 girls who had low numbers. This left U11s with no subs in certain games, but we used these opportunities to help the girls understand club culture and the need to help other teams when required.

I have volunteered to coach the girls in U13G next year but will require an official. We're already playing in the U13 iLax competition at Westminster with Hannah Greenhalgh and my daughter Ella who will both be 2nd year U13s next year. I'm hoping Ella will join us from GLC in 2022.

It has been my absolute pleasure to coach the SLC U11G this year and I'd like to thank Dana Gibson my team manager and Stacey Appleton, Paul Scuteri, Peter Greenhalgh and Thomas Tuxford for their support throughout the year.

UNDER 11 BOYS

We started the season with only 5 players registered, just enough to field a team. This is the total number of players the team had for the entire season.

Despite needing to borrow players from the opposing team each and every week, our players turned up each and every week to play, and to play hard.

The girls had a tough season this year. We only had 6 players and had to rely heavily on the ulls who were not always willing or organised enough to come up, with exception of Ava gibson who was always happy and ready to play up for us. A lot of the ul3s parents were annoyed at the fact we would have to wait until the last minute before our game to know if we had to forfeit or not. It was also a bit confusing to a few of the parents as to why the ul3s were not merging with the ul5s for the whole season, as both teams had to have players play up.

We had to play 8 a side for the season which our girls worked with and did amazing, however multiple other teams did not agree with and tried to tell the umpires that we had forfeited before games, good thing our scorer was there to correct them and the umpires double checked with me. Another thing to note is that players from other teams were yelling, swearing and playing extremely rough, with checking, shoving and tripping during games, yet the girls played through it.

This group of girls are a promising group who have improved so much this year. I would love to continue coaching next year, although I have been told that the u13s and 15s now have coaches, if I could be considered to coach the u18s that would be amazing.

The under 13 boys had a good mix of first timers (3), under 11s playing up (3), under 11 graduates, second year U13s and under 13s who also play under 15s. 17 players when when the whole team was there.

Having this many players was a great challenge to have but when we played clubs who forced the 8-a-side, managing the bench was an extremely tough ask. For the most part, the coaches were able to try and manage the bench so that everyone was getting a run and we were still competitive.

As a team we really focussed on body position defence and working hard as a team to get the ground ball. We often were complemented on how hard the boys played in defence as our body position would often force the other teams to make forced errors. We stressed that stick checks, particularly at this level, are more often going to get you a penalty rather than turn the ball over.

We made finals by finishing 3rd, however in the final we were missing 3 key players for various reasons. We got off to a bad start losing by about 6 at quarter time. But we made a couple of crucial coaching decisions and the boys played super hard. We still lost by 3 goals but after quarter time we won the game... just got off to a bad start.
