Our club needs more players.

Ideally we would like to have 3 men's teams and 2 women's next year but this relies heavily on this year's contingent committing to playing again, plus any eligible juniors playing in senior grades.

Our women's Div 1 team relies heavily on juniors. We would love to recruit.

Our junior girls' teams rely solely on lower grade players playing up.

Our junior boys' teams are merged with Burnside.

Simply put, we need to retain ALL current members and attract new members to our club.

### **Finances**

Revenue from Senior Nationals was over \$40k. We did take a risk and bought a lot of assets prior to the event, with the hope that we would recoup the expenditure. We did.

- Improved POS Terminal including till, barcode reader and printer
- 2x branded gazebos which will continue to be used for many years
- 4x extra lower quality gazebos to allow 3 gazebos on each field
- 2x new small deep friers to provide gluten free food with low risk of contamination
- New pegs, stakes, and bunting for field setup
- Merchandise stock to enable merch to be purchased all season for immediate use

The following are all positive points:

- Player Fees are up significantly.
- Canteen Sales, without the Nationals turnover, is still up significantly.
- Sponsorship increased.
- Sports vouchers are up
- Only extra expenditure was the full year of ground hire and Senior nationals costs
  - Senior Nationals costs includes the assets mentioned above

### Things to watch out for:

Ground hire was a full year so extra revenue was needed.

# Relationship with The Office for Recreation Sport and Racing (ORSR)

It was expected that The City of Mitcham was going to take over the management of the site from June 30 2023. This did not eventuate, mostly due to the inability to bring the Sturt Baseball Club to the site. We will continue our arrangements as per the original lease understanding with ORSR.

It's important to understand that we are a user of the facility only on our assigned dates and times. At all other times, anyone approved by ORSR may have use of the facility. This means we must always leave the rooms, including the change rooms and "clubrooms", in a clean state. All club members should ensure this on a daily basis.

### **TREASURERS REPORT 2023**

The following is the treasures report for the period as per follows:

- Dates 1 October 2022 30 September 2023
- The Clubs gross receipts are less than \$500,000 as a result the clubs financial records are not required and have not been to be audited.

### **SUMMARY**

### **Key Points:**

- The operations of the club resulted in a surplus for the year of \$479.
- The club now has access to the facilities for the full year and will therefore be able to generate income in the summer period (off season) where in prior years we were unable to which with the stock on hand that hasn't been sold to date provides the opportunity to sell the stock that we have on hand totalling \$5,750.
- The 2023 season was the first full financial season at the recently developed facilities. For the 2022 year as the grounds were under development in the 2022-year rental was only paid for 5 Months and 19 days.
- The Club held the Senior Nationals competition in June 2023, this is a once off event for the club hence this has been separated in the accounts for ongoing comparison and clarity.

### Senior Nationals - June 2023

The club hosted the Senior Nationals Completion.

Financially whilst providing a benefit to the club it would be fair to say that net result was below our initial expectations which can be attributed to slightly lower turnover in the canteen and bar and higher costs that anticipated being ground hire and fees to Lacrosse Australia.

Allocating the costs associated with the event it shows that hosting the nationals generated a profit for the club of \$7,916.

In allocating the costs for Bar & Canteen supplies, as a significant level of stock was purchased that was not sold during the nationals but retained and sold during the season. Accordingly, I have allocated the costs for the bar and canteen based on the selling margin for the year.

In addition, the club was able to upgrade much needed equipment for example new Gazebo's, Square Terminal and other items that are a significant improvement it the clubs' assets and will be used by the club into the future.

### **Club Operations – Excluding Senior Nationals**

### Income

Canteen & Bar Sales

The Canteen & Bar for the year generated an income of \$59,673, allowing for costs of \$31,140 this resulted in a contribution of \$28,533 for the year.

As compared the last year where virtually all stock was sold, there is significant value of stock approximately \$5,750 which has been accounted for in the books at the end of the year which is non perishable will be used in future events or next season to generate income including:

- Junior presentation day
- Sixes tournament
- Functions (ie Engagement party held in late September)

As we have access to the club rooms for the full 12 months the club is looking at all opportunities to utilise the rooms over the summer season to generate additional revenue.

### **Player Fees**

The club had 83 registered players for the 2023 year. The Player fees for the year was \$25,339 being fees from members of \$21,939 and sports vouchers of \$3,400.

For context for each player, we are charged by Lacrosse SA \$215.00 irrespective of age.

### **Expenses**

The total expenses of the club (excluding canteen and bar) for the 12 months was \$63,495 as compared to \$55,232 for the prior year, commentary on the main expenses is as follows:

### **Ground Rental**

Ground rental has been set by the Office for Recreation at \$24,750 per annum including lighting. This is charged to us on a monthly basis commencing 12 May 2022.

The additional \$968.00 over this amount represents additional lighting use outside of contracted times.

### **Team Nomination Fees**

Team nomination fees are based on the number of registered players we have at \$215.00 per person irrespective of age.

### **Umpire Fees**

Based on the number of teams registered.

### **Bank Account**

During the year the club opened up a new bank account with Bendigo Bank, the clubs existing people's choice bank account did not allow for 2 person electronic approval which meant that payment to suppliers etc required writing of cheques which was time consuming.

Bendigo Bank was chosen as they offer associations no fee accounts and allow 2 person authorisation of bill payments
